

Robert Chamberlain was born in Tenino, Washington, a long time ago. He graduated high school there in 1947. He then worked at various jobs including sign painting and a short stint in the woods while waiting to be called into the army during the Korean War.

In 1954 he entered art school in Seattle, where upon completion he was hired as a designer with a packaging firm. After two years there he worked in a downtown Seattle advertising agency as Assistant Art Director.

In 1960 he began operating his own art studio in Olympia doing graphic arts and painting. His paintings have been featured in one-man art shows in Washington, Arizona, and Oregon.

One of his two most noted series of watercolors was a 75 painting show illustrating the history of logging in Western Washington, exhibited by the Washington State Historical Society in Tacoma.

Most recently he completed 8 large paintings depicting the social and architectural history of Olympia. They currently are exhibited at the Olympia Timberland Library.

Robert and his wife Margaret have raised three children and make their home at Kamilche Point in Mason County, where they also have a large studio.
